'Walk &Talk' event

Tuesday, October 18

As part of the Faro seminar, we are organising a 'Walk &Talk' event to get acquainted with some Estonian heritage places and communities.

We invite you to take part in the visit to **Kalamaja neighbourhood**, including a visit to **Kalamaja Community Museum**. Kalamaja is a wooden suburb between the fortified Old Town of Tallinn and sea, once populated by fishermen, harbour workers, and craftsmen, now one of the trendiest neighbourhoods in Tallinn, with a bohemian atmosphere.

The walk will take us also to **Kopli peninsula**, to the settlement of the former shipbuilding factory, currently under refurbishment. We continue through the area formerly known as the Professors' Village, to the **Community Centre at Kopli 93** – an old cultural centre is turned into a community house, housing a local makerspace and a community garden.
